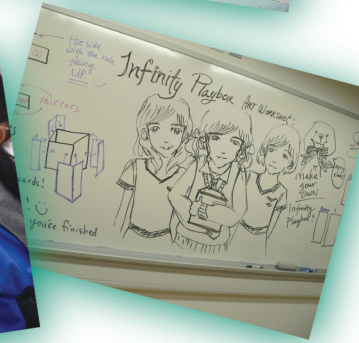
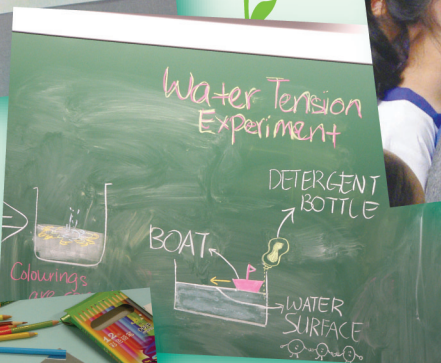
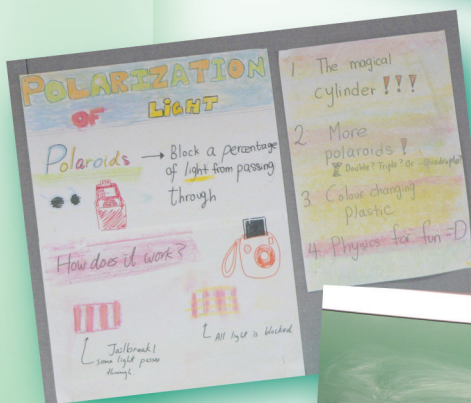


Students Mentoring Students
