10. Life Education Programme (LEP) and Project T

a) LEP

This year the team aligned with the School’s theme on patience and humility in the LEP programme. The Adopt-an-NTS project was introduced again this year. To honour our non-teaching staff (NTS), each class “adopted” an NTS and was responsible for getting to know them better and to express gratitude on behalf of the rest of the school.

b) Project T (Project 30)

In 2022-2023, teachers were assigned to 2 cycles of their original project and 1 cycle of a new project among the 5 cycles of Project T. Through the implementation of a project designed by other colleagues, meaningful community learning and development were promoted, so that teachers could learn from each other and improve their skills as effective facilitators and project teachers. 1.	<p>Waste Paper Collection and Recycling Scheme</p> <p>This was a year-round event to encourage everyone in the school to recycle and reuse paper products. Plastics, metal and disposable drink cartons can also be recycled at school.</p>
2.	<p>Mooncake Tin Boxes Recycling and Mooncake Donation Campaign</p> <p>The mooncake tin boxes recycling and mooncake donation campaign was organised in September 2022 to encourage students to reduce the amount of waste disposed of in our landfill sites during the Mid-Autumn Festival. The School served as a collection point where students could drop off their mooncake tin boxes or excess mooncakes. 4.	<p>Pr. 4 Environmental Activity (26th October and 28th October 2022)</p> <p>The Pr. 4 Environmental Activity was a mass game played by two classes each time. The mass game “Earth Hero” was designed by the WWF STEP Programme and run by the Environmental Education Team. Through a fun and engaging mass game, students were required to work in teams to solve various problems and further develop their understanding of the relationship between natural resources and humans.</p>
5.	<p>Pr. 1 Environmental Talk by Plastic Free Seas (18th November 2022)</p> <p>The Pr. 1 Environmental Talk by Plastic Free Seas told the tale of plastics, from how they enter the ocean and the effects they can have on marine animals. There was a particular focus on the impact of single-use plastics on marine animals and the environment. Through the connections drawn, students developed a deeper understanding of how single-use and disposable plastics can harm the environment and, most importantly, sustainable actions they can take in their everyday life to make a difference.</p>
6.	<p>Pr. 5 Environmental Talk by Plastic Free Seas (24th February 2023 and 10th March 2023)</p> <p>The Pr. 5 Environmental Talk by Plastic Free Seas focused on the topic of “Plastics Pollution on Wildlife and Environment in Hong Kong”. They delved deeper into plastics pollution by understanding how plastics is produced and the harmful impacts that plastics, specifically single-use plastics and microplastics, has on the environment. Plastic Free Seas presented students with different strategies they can incorporate into their everyday life to reduce their amount of plastic waste. It was a fruitful</p>

	experience allowing students to rethink what they know about plastics.
7.	<p>Pr. 5 Beach Cleanup in March 2023</p> <p>A beach cleanup was arranged for each Pr. 5 class by Plastic Free Seas throughout the month of March. It was a joint activity with the GSI Department. The beach cleanups allowed students to look at the amount of rubbish being washed up or thrown away on our coastlines. It was a meaningful experience where they could see the impacts of littering, how to make a difference and reflect on how our actions directly impact the environment. They were able to take action and do their part by cleaning up the beach.</p>
8.	<p>Pr. 3 Environmental Talk by Redress (17th March 2023)</p> <p>The Pr. 3 Environmental Talk by Redress focused on bringing awareness to sustainable clothing habits. Redress brought students' attention to the overall production of clothes and the different impacts it has on the environment. Students were presented with ways to reduce clothing waste, such as upcycling it into a tote bag or donating it for someone to reuse.</p>
9.	<p>Pr. 6 Environmental Talk by Redress (24th March 2023)</p> <p>The Pr. 6 Environmental Talk by Redress provided an overview of the complex and overlooked process of how clothes are produced and ultimately sold in stores. By developing awareness of the rise of fast fashion through social media, branding and marketing, students can understand its impact on overproduction and consumption in the fashion industry and the environmental and human impacts. Redress provided them with various strategies they could incorporate into their daily life to take action and extend the life cycle of their clothes.</p>
10.	<p>Earth Hour (29th March 2023)</p> <p>The whole school participated in Earth Hour 2023, organised by WWF – Hong Kong, from 8:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. on 29th March 2023. Students were encouraged to join this event at home with their families after a Morning Assembly sharing by Environmental Ambassadors on 28th March 2023. Afterwards, students were invited to share photos and reflections in Google Classroom on how they had participated in this meaningful event.</p>

8.	In order to enhance students’ understanding of the Constitution, a presentation on the Constitution and Basic Law for the National Constitution Day (4 th December 2022) was conducted during Morning Assembly on 5 th December 2022.
9.	To mourn the death of our former President of China, Jiang Zemin, both the Senior and Junior Schools joined the citywide arrangements at 10 a.m. on 6 th December 2022 by observing 3 minutes of silence. This was done through the PA system with students staying in the classroom. The ceremony was led by the Head Girl of the Senior School.

10.	After Morning Assembly on 7 th December 2022, the whole school watched the pre-recorded video of the flags being lowered to half-mast in the Senior School campus and also clips of the Memorial Service of the former President of China, Jiang Zemin on 6 th December 2022.
11.	To encourage students to learn more about China, display boards on “Chinese New Year and Lantern Festival” were set up in January 2023. There was also an online quiz competition participated by 502 students.

c) Workshop on “Reading Across Curriculum (RAC)”

A workshop on “Reading Across Curriculum (RAC)” was organised for teachers on 3rd January 2023. Teachers were facilitated by Mr. Sheridan Lee, Mr. Marco Lin and Mrs. Rosanna Chong, all of whom are veteran leaders in education, to rediscover what reading is and to establish meaningful links between concepts and ideas of reading in primary school.

Teachers were inspired to make these new-found connections with their current Project T projects and to instil a love of purposeful reading in our students.

d) Professional Learning Communities (PLCs)

A new approach in professional development, Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) was introduced in April 2023. The PD team (Staff Development Team) ran a series of PLCs on different topics. PLCs are groups of educators who come together to collaborate, share knowledge and expertise, and work towards a common goal of improving our teaching practice so that we can create a sharing culture in our school.

As educators, we understand the importance of ongoing professional development, and PLCs provide a structured way for teachers to engage in continuous learning and growth. By joining the PLCs, teachers enjoy the opportunity to collaborate with colleagues who share similar interests and goals, and explore new ideas, strategies and practices together to enhance teaching and learning.
